From my perspective, here are some of the evidences that the Lord was at work in and through WBC in 2016.

How we began the year—Four initiatives

As we began the past year we renewed a commitment to four initiatives established the previous year (2015).

1. To show we love the lost as Jesus did.
2. To leave our comfort zones to meet needs as Jesus did, starting with our brothers and sisters.
3. To embrace suffering as Jesus did.
4. To give more attention to prayer, as Jesus did.

That’s what was on our heart as a church as we began 2016. That’s what we were asking the Lord to do in and through us this past twelve months.

What did the Lord accomplish at WBC in 2016?

I think the numbers reflect another evidence of this growing love for the Lord. I invite you to rejoice and give thanks as you hear these numbers. We have ? members currently at WBC. Our weekly Sunday morning average attendance in 2016 was 127, on Sunday evening 60, on Wednesday evening 59.

The Lord used those people to give us General Fund income of
(last year was \$239,625, a weekly average of \$4609).¹

In 2015 we exceeded our budgeted need by over \$22,000 and were approximately \$12,000 over our General Fund expenses for the year.

That deserves a thanks be to God!

On top of this was the special Harvest Offering in November of approximately \$1900 which is being used to add video/streaming equipment.

Dennis DeCamp and the community center team have strategized various ways to let our community know we care about it, so we can communicate why we care, which of course is the gospel.

There were pancake breakfasts...

We offered space to community members for baby showers, funeral meals, anniversary parties, and birthday parties. Sports teams were fed. The Gideons used our building. So did the Porter Township Over 55 Club. And the Area Agency on Aging. And the county extension office for classes. And the Girl Scouts. And Lifeline Screening. And others.

In the past twelve months our church provided approximately 150 sessions of free biblical counseling for people from the Tri-State struggling with problems. Tri-State Bible College is now offering college credit for our weekend CDT.

In 2016 our counseling team taught our counseling and discipleship training class to over one hundred people, at our facility in the winter, in Charleston in the spring, and at River Cities Church in Huntington for the second time in the fall.

Those from our church serving at CRADLE continue to show love to those in our community facing difficult challenges. Our sister, Melanie Malone, began serving in the position of Executive Director.

Once again in the summer a wonderful team of approximately 30 Scioto Hills summer staffers worshipped at WBC (in the past 25 years over 600 young staffers). These godly young people are now serving the Lord in their own churches and communities around the country and world.
