## Purpose of 1 Samuel:

- 1. It enables us to get to know God better.
- 2. It provides us with a model of God's kind of person, namely David.

- 1. He inquired of the Lord (4).
- 2. He acted in obedience to the Lord (5).

## II. Dangerous Situation #2 (7-13)

#### **B.** Who was the threat?

- 1. Saul (7-8)
- 2. The citizens of Keilah (12)

## C. How did David respond to the danger?

- 1. He called for the priest and the ephod (9).
- 2. He inquired of the Lord (10-12).
- 3. He left the city (13).

#### III. Dangerous Situation #3 (14-29)

A. Where? (14)

#### **B.** Who was the threat?

- 1. Saul (14)
- 2. The Ziphites (19-20)

#### C. How did David respond to the danger?

- 1. He took the defensive, and did all he could to avoid Saul (26).
- 2. He waited on God's intervention (27-28).
- 3. He went to a place of security (29).

## **Lessons:**

- 1. David was a man who looked at obstacles as opportunities to glorify God. So must we.
- 2. David's focus was not on getting rid of the trial, but on being God's kind of person in the midst of the trial. That must be our focus, too.
