### II. ADMONITION OF CHILDREN (teaching): The building of godly inner convictions within a child

- A. Biblical motives for teaching
  - 1. Realize both parent and child are responsible to \_\_\_\_\_.

  - 3. Recognize that God's way is always the \_\_\_\_\_ and is essential for living the blessed life.

# **III. NURTURE OF CHIDREN (structure): The planning and following through with correction**

- A. We must possess the following convictions.
  - 1. Children are not \_\_\_\_\_. They are sinners.
  - You are to bring them up to live for God and under God. Key: Be convinced that you are God's \_\_\_\_\_.

- D. Establish Appropriate Rewards and Discipline/Correction
  - 1. A common practice throughout Scripture: deed & consequence!

Dt. 27:18-26; ch 28	l Cor. 9:24-27
Jn. 3:36	Gal. 6:7

- 2. Observations about discipline and rewards:
  - (1) More immediate for a small child (Prov. 13:12)
  - (2) Focus upon *daily habit* that needs changing!
  - (3) Hus./Wife list strengths & weaknesses of each child.
  - (4) List goals (Positive character qualities)
  - (5) Find appropriate rewards & discipline.
- E. Behavior Contract (cf. Christian Living in the Home, pp. 123-125)

2. General Obedience	No rod	Rod
3. No sassing	No soap	Soap in mouth
<ol> <li>Schoolwork done well work posted work done</li> </ol>	Snack Acceptable TV or play	No snack No TV or play


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- F. Follow Through in Love (cf. Withhold Not Correction, Bruce A. Ray)

  - 5. Expect \_\_\_\_\_.


