  - ✓ Disciples were first called "Christians" 26b
  - ✓ Gentile benevolence to Jewish believers 27-29
  - ✓ First mention of "elders" 29

- ✓ De-emphasis on Secondary issues

- ✓ Christian influence surging worldwide

- ✓ Financial stability with far greater potential
- ✓ Strong Biblical teaching with cautious praise
- √ New ministries developing
